

Through lectures, case studies and small group breakout sessions, topics to be explored will include: the evolution of cardiac surgical procedures, pediatric to adult care transition, nutrition management, nurse-patient-family coping strategies, nursing innovation, research and quality improvement initiatives. True to our mission to foster professional development within our membership, the agenda will also include presentations by new speakers.

Our annual meeting will be held in the Main Auditorium at the conclusion of the conference presentations. An optional tour of the cardiac facilities at Children's National Medical Center will be provided on Saturday afternoon.
